

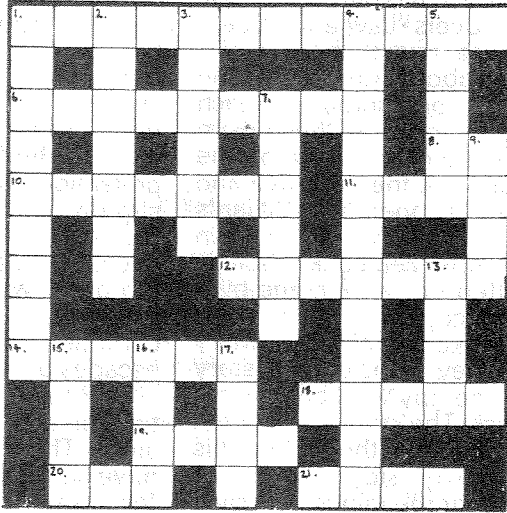
PRIZE CROSSWORD

Clovenstone

Adventure Playground



Clovenstone Adventure Playground is the only one of the playgrounds being built around Wester Hailes that is actually sited on Education Department property. Permission had to be obtained from the headmaster and the divisional education officer, before district council planning permission could be given to begin work.

Work began in June with the clearing of the site, and work progressed slowly throughout the summer and autumn. By November there were several small, brightly painted structures on the site, but bad weather has hampered work during the winter, and site drainage has been one of the most persistent problems. Recently a sand pit and a new structure have been built, and the main work in progress on the site at present is the digging of holes for a surrounding fence.

The Playground is frequently used by children from the school, and the coming of spring, along with the drying out of the ground should see more activity there.

This is one of the first adventure playgrounds in Edinburgh to have so close a connection with a particular school, and co-operation and understanding between the school, the workers and

the playground committee are essential to developing it's full potential, also it is hoped that the Clovenstone Community Centre can be involved in organising activities during the school holidays.
