The present playground structures are most satisfying to older children in primary schools, but ideally, there should be entertainment for all ages, from toddlers to teenagers, and it should also have indoor facilities for use in bad weather.

In the past year the Playground was supervised by two Playleaders but unfortunately there may be no one to do this job this year. That means that parents and adults will have to offer some of their free time to allow children to continue to play there. Yet this need not be a chore; on the contrary, it could prove a vast worthwhile and rewarding experience for those involved.

An interesting survey undertaken recently to evaluate adults feelings about the Playground produced opposing reactions; some complained of the dangers involved playing there, while others claimed it was not near adventurous enough; many did not see it as being important, and as many again regarded it as the best play facility in Wester Hailes. The view of children who play there is unmistakable from the very large number who attend in favourable weather.


