NO TO YOUTH **CLUB**

IN RECENT WEEKS the Dumbryden Grove Neighbourhood Council has been extremely busy on your behalf.

We have lodged an objection to the application for planning permission to build the Pyramid Youth Centre in the grounds of Dumbryden School and have written to all the councillors in Lothian informing them of the very strong feelings in the neighbourhood and asking for their support on your

It is our understanding that, despite rumours to the contrary, planning permission has not yet been passed at the time of writing this and we hope the views of the people most affected by the plans given consideration.

The feasibility study for the Grove has been completed and was well received by all who took the opportunity to view the plans when they were displayed on Neighbourhood bus.

Also on view were the proposed works to be carried out under the Roadside and Boundaries planting scheme with work starting this winter.

Your council have elected two reps to the Dumbryden Environmental group who will negotiate with Scottish Homes regarding the £1.2 million which will be spent on the environmental changes in the four Dumbryden neighbourhoods. You will be kept informed of developments.

CALDERS FIRST

THE RESIDENTS of Calder Court and Calder Gardens are proud to be the first low-rise housing area to set up a neighbourhood council in the Calders.

After a successful launch on July 30th, 12 local residents were elected and their job is to represent and look after the interests of everyone living in the area.

The boundaries of Calder Court/Gardens East were identified at the launch. It includes 1 - 15 Calder Court and 38, 40 and 77 - 85 Calder Gardens.

All the land and housing within the area are the concern of the neighbourhood council, as are the areas of common interest such as the local primary school, community centre, shops, WHEC, the Patch and the Church.

A major issue which residents in the area feel very strongly about is the speeding of traffic on the Calder Gardens road.

Cllr Margaret McCulloch attended the meeting and addressed locals about the problem, saying that she would give her full support to the introduction of slow signs or speed bumps. We will keep residents up to date on the outcome of this
